

During that same time period, Swartz was busy coaching the Crusader gridders to a 41-30 mark before resigning to pursue his doctorate in 1968. Season Outlook

Hopes for the Crusaders to recapture the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin crown which Wheaton lost to Augustana last year rest mainly on a small core of returning lettermen and some good freshmen talent.

Juniors John Ortberg and Paul Jorden are the most experienced of the Wheaton netters this season. Ortberg, who was runner-up in the CCIW at number two as a freshman, will be moving to the number one position this season. Jorden won the conference championship at number six his freshman year and then captured the number five position last year at the CCIW meet.

Sophomore Jon Hollansworth and junior Joe Hicks are the only two Crusaders besides Ortberg and Jorden to experience varsity competition. Hollansworth was second in the CCIW at number three a year ago and Hicks took runner-up in the sixth slot.

The Crusaders claim nine freshmen on their roster this season, all seeking a chance to help Wheaton's tennis program. Norm Peterson, Eric Fowler, and Brad Smith appear to be the top prospects in preseason workouts.
